PASTOR'S ARTICLE

As I write this, I have been home now for a week after going through rather extensive knee surgery. I have tried to remain diligent in my pastoral duties but appreciate your patience while I heal. But one thing that has helped make it all go better, are the cards and phone calls and even visits I have had from people who express their care and concern for me and wished me well.

As we enter the Season of Advent and prepare to once again celebrate the birth of Jesus Christ, we enter into a time of some contemplation. While it's easy to get caught up in the hustle and bustle and materialism of Christmas, the four weeks of Advent are there to help us ponder, if only now and then, the wonder and marvel and goodness of what the Nativity of our Lord really means.

What it means, maybe more than anything else, is that God cares enough about us, about his humanity, to come be with us. To not only visit with us, but also express his concern, his good wishes, yes, his love for humanity, by sending us Jesus. And when you wish anyone a "Merry Christmas" remember that you are not just wishing them good cheer and to be happy. Think of it also as a way of saying to them that the God of us all, in sending Jesus to earth, wishes and brings them healing and wellness.
