Bible Study with Pastor

Do you have worries, anxieties and stress over things in your life (both real and imagined)? Welcome to the club. Pastor continues his bible study class this month on the topic of "**Worry and Faith**".

Then, with All Saints Day coming in early November, we will move on to study some of the great **Saints of the Christian Church**. The Lutheran Confessions call on us to remember those who have gone before us in the sign of faith and to give thanks for their faithful witness to that faith. And so, for the next five weeks, we will try to do just that. Various days on our fall calendar mark the deaths of many of those saints - St. Augustine (Aug. 28), St. Jerome (Sept.30), St. Francis of Assisi (Oct. 4), St. Ignatius of Antioch (Oct. 17) and St. Martin of Tours, whom Martin Luther was named after (Nov. 11). They will all be topics of our study as we will attempt to look at some of the specific bible verses that inspired them and their ministries.

Gatherings are **Tuesday evenings** at church (downstairs in the Adult Study Classroom) from **7- 8 p.m.** and/or **Thursday mornings** at Sanatoga Retirement Community Center from **10-11 a.m.** These sessions will conclude on November 9 and 11.

A Note from our New Director of Music Ministries



Hello, St. James! I am very excited to be your new Director of Music Ministries and to be a part of your ministry staff. I look forward to getting to know you all and share in our music ministry together in our Worship Services, choir program and concerts here at the church. Many of you know that I was here, many years ago, as your church musician and that my daughter Susan was baptized and married here at St. James; so it is very comfortable for Marcia and I to return after our “time away”... one choir member said that they were just “saving our seat”.

As we start our worship experiences together, I would like you to take an extra minute before worship and check out the source of the Prelude as found in the bulletin. To discover “the source”, all you have to do is find the initials after the prelude title (LBW - green, WOV - blue), along with the page number. These indicate the hymnal and page of the tune. I would also encourage you to read the verses of the hymn as the prelude is being played. The name given to the tune will be in italics and may look to be in a different language. You might even be able to guess what country the tune is from by its tune name - kids might enjoy doing this, too. They can also discover that the hymn tune name is on the bottom, right-hand side of the page, in each of the hymnals; the composer of the tune and writer of the text is on the bottom left hand side. Even their names might give you a clue to the origin of the hymn.

You are encouraged to SING OUT in worship and are invited to JOIN one of the choirs. Look for more opportunities to participate in the Music Ministry Program in the near future! If you have any comments or suggestions, please come talk to me and let me know what you think – I appreciate your opinions.

I thank you all for the opportunity of bringing Music Ministry to you and will close with the words of J. S. Bach: SOLI DEO GLORIA – to God alone be the glory!

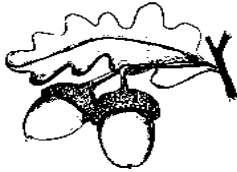
