A Note From Pastor Hutchinson

Lift up the Voice! Sing Songs of Praise!

Martin Luther once said, “*Those who sing, pray twice*” meaning that when we sing hymns in worship, we offer up to God, not only words of praise but also a wonderful sound of music when our voices are raised.

Now I would love it if I looked out in the congregation each Sunday and saw everybody singing along heartily. And yet I know that not everybody is comfortable singing, (not that you need a terrific voice to sing to God – because God is not a music critic). But did you know that when you don’t sing the hymns that you miss more than just the chance to sing to God? What you miss are the all important WORDS of the hymns (as well as those in the liturgy).

Those words, written by so many wonderful Christian people, both long ago and recently, are words of faith, hope and love. They are words to help guide us in faith and understanding of how God the Father works, and thinks, and deals with us. They are words that help us to feel the volume of God’s love through Christ’s suffering and sacrifice. They are words that are no less powerful than the biblical words we hear during worship by which the Holy Spirit touches our hearts with hope in the promise of resurrection, in our daily world and in the world to come.

So when we don’t sing in worship a forgiving and understanding God can tolerate the absence of a few voices. But when we don’t even open the hymnal and look at the words we lose so much ourselves. We lose a chance to enhance our trust in God and a chance to further change our lives and the lives of others for the better.

As Reformation Sunday approaches, let us not forget that singing was so important to the great Reformers of the Church. But let us remember too, that the written word of God’s love was so very much an important part of that.

Let’s all be a part of that too.

The Cluster Outreach Center

The Cluster Outreach Center is a ministry of The Pottstown Cluster of Religious Communities, which represents over 60 congregations in an interfaith effort to provide for the needs of the community. The Outreach Center is a tangible expression of God's love in our world today. For the first half of this year, the Cluster Outreach Center has served 15, 335 persons by providing over \$17,000 in financial assistance, serving over 8,531 persons through Community Meals and providing food, furniture and clothing to 6,800. Without the support of the faith communities of Pottstown this would not have been possible.

Sunday Morning Adult Education Opportunities

Two adult education opportunities are available in October on Sunday mornings at 9:30 a.m.

Seasons of the Spirit – This is a lectionary-based Bible study that shapes and transforms lives. Each week the class will take an in-depth look at the Bible readings heard that week in worship while discovering and learning to share God's Word. The class teaches, inspires and involves its members in prayer and spiritual growth. The group will meet in the Adult Study classroom on the ground floor. Individuals can join this class anytime throughout the year.

Sing the Faith - *Sing the Faith* is a Bible study focusing on common traditional hymns and their biblical roots, background, and application to daily life. **You do not need to sing to join this class.** The class will look at hymns that express the presence of God, the concept of grace and comfort, and on community and what it means to be in unity. 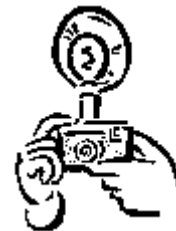
Congratulations
